French artist inspired by Keats poetry

EMERGING French artist Tess Dumon is to showcase her first exhibition in China — "A Thing of Beauty is a Joy Forever."

Running through December 29 at the Galerie Dumonteil, the exhibit features most of her recent creations, including a dozen gouache paintings and several sculptures, from her Shanghai residency.

The theme of the artist's exhibition "A Thing of Beauty is a Joy Forever" originated from a John Keats poem "Endymion."

In "Endymion" the poet states that something beautiful will give pleasure long after it ceases to exist.

Born in 1990, Dumon trained at the Atelier de Sevres in Paris, moved to London for sculpture studies in Central Saint Martins before finishing her MA at the Royal College of Art.

Having no clue about the origins of her brother's autism, Dumon turned toward myths, symbols and legends at a very young age.

During her artistic studies, she

started to create her own mythology, including horses from her brother's horse therapy sessions, unique handmade blue paint and poems.

In this exhibition, the artist combines her story with terms and elements selected from Buddhism, Taoism and Chinese folklore.

The visually captivating sculptures have always been a significant part of her creation.

The aluminum and stainless steel used in her sculptures reflect perfectly any incoming ray of light, contrasting with the dramatic meaning of her work and the roughness of the material she sculpts by hand.

The spotlight of her work on paper at the exhibition is "Amber" which retells an early Chinese tale about tigers, whose souls enter the earth and become amber — a belief that attempts to associate immortality with an object that takes millions of years to form.

'Writer: Picasso'

The exhibition showcases Spanish painter Pablo Picasso's lesser-known talent of being a poet. Picasso's literary career began in 1935 and he created more than 350 poems. Visitors to the exhibition get to see photographs and publications related to Piccaso's literary creation. A documentary is specially produced, which includes interviews with Spanish writers and intellectuals in memory of Picasso and his works. A rare exhibit is also unveiled: the original manuscript of a congratulatory message drafted by Chinese poet and scholar Guo Moruo in 1961 on behalf of the Chinese government to congratulate Picasso on his 80th birthday. Los Angeles-based artist Christina Quarles is presenting her latest artworks in Shanghai - her first foray into the Chinese art scene. She mainly works with acrylics and uses different techniques of paint to create depth and form in her bodily figures. The solo is presenting five medium-sized paintings that feature distinctive polymorphous figurations of androgynous bodies with limbs tangled in a labyrinth of flesh. Decorative motifs such as plaids, florals checkerboard and lattice - markers of femininity and domesticity, form the background of her paintings against the contorted figures. Each individual painting's composition is balanced using bright colors, rich texture and big gestural curves.
