The first prize was £2,500, with the runner up receiving £500.

Helen Scott Lidgett Studio Award

This award – which was open to MA students studying Fine Art, Photography, or Art and Science – provides a bridge between art school and work as a professional artist. Winner Emma Corral will be given a rent-free studio for one year, together with a bursary of £5,000 and the opportunity to access curators, other professional artists and networking opportunities.




Kate Barton Award for Painting
